### Course Description

ACA 122 is a one-credit hour, two-contact hour class that is all about you. The class will address three major themes to prepare you for academic success:

- 1. goal discernment (including transfer and career goals),
- 2. learning strategies (including time management and test-taking strategies), and
- 3. college culture (including campus resources and college student responsibilities).

The course has been designed specifically for new college students. See the course learning outcomes below for specific course content.

#### Learning Outcomes

See the <u>course outline</u> on the Durham Tech website for full details. Upon completion of this course, you will be able to:

- Develop a strategic plan for completing community college academic goals, including certificates, diplomas, and/or associate degrees.
- O Develop a strategic plan for transferring to a university and preparing for a new career.
- Identify the rights and responsibilities of transfer students under the Comprehensive Articulation Agreement (CAA), including Universal General Education Transfer Component (UGETC) designated courses, the Transfer Assured Admissions Policy (TAAP), the CAA appeals process, and university tuition surcharge.
- Evaluate learning strategies, including note-taking, test-taking, information processing, time management, and memorization techniques, and identify strategies for improvement.
- o Identify essential college resources, including financial aid, advising, registration, tutoring, library services, computer labs, and counseling services and recognize the importance of these resources on student success.
- Identify essential college policies and procedures, including academic integrity such as avoiding plagiarism; calculating a GPA; and maintaining satisfactory academic progress for financial aid eligibility and/or good academic standing.
- Identify your learning style preferences and demonstrate ways to learn new information using your specific learning style preferences.
- Explain the rights and responsibilities of a college student and an advisee.

## **Important Course and College Policies**

### Online Course Information

This course is asynchronous but not self-paced. This means you will have weekly deadlines to meet, but your instructor and classmates do not have to be online at the same time. Each week you will have new activities, readings, and/or discussions to complete on Sakai by the end of the week. You may log into the course and complete the assignments at any time as long as you complete the activities by the weekly due date. This type of instruction requires strong time management and communication skills of both the instructor and the students.

All ACA 122-190 assignments are due by 4:00 p.m. on Tuesdays.

All ACA 122-190 blog and forum assignments will have two deadlines: (1) post a new message by 4:00 p.m. on Sunday and (2) reply to a classmate by 4:00 p.m. on Tuesday.

New weekly folders will be available each Wednesday morning at 8:00 a.m.

To be successful in an online learning environment, you must check into the course frequently: at least three times during the week. Each time you log in, take few minutes to review the Announcements to see if there have been any important announcements about assignments or course content.

Please do not attempt to complete the coursework in one sitting during the week. You should plan to spend 4-5 hours each week working on this class. You might spend that time reading your textbook, posting messages in the Forums, looking at online media linked to our <u>Sakai</u> site, completing assignments, or emailing your instructor. ## Attendance Policy

You must actively participate to succeed in this course and in college in general. The discussions and activities on Sakai will help you improve your success at Durham Tech. They will also help your grade.

You will demonstrate your attendance in this class by completing a weekly quiz. If you fail to complete more quizzes than are allowed, then you may receive a grade of F for the semester (discussed below). You will also receive a grade for your attendance by completing the weekly quizzes.

Durham Tech students are allowed one excused absence per class per term for a planned event or observance. Students who wish to use the excused absence must complete and submit an <a href="Excused Absence Notification form">Excused Absence Notification form</a> available on the Durham Tech website at least fourteen calendar days in advance of the day of the scheduled absence. All class work missed due to an excused absence must be made up. The instructor, in consultation with the student, will identify a deadline for submission of the work that is appropriate to the requirements of the class, but no later than one week after the day of the scheduled absence.

# Withdrawal Policy

Any student with consecutive absences equaling or exceeding 15% of the instructional hours for the course before the official withdrawal date for the course will be withdrawn from the class by the instructor and will receive a grade of W. Students with consecutive absences equaling or exceeding 15% of the instructional hours for the course after the official withdrawal date for the course will be withdrawn from the class by the instructor and will receive a grade of F.

For ACA 122-190, three absences (as demonstrated by completion of the weekly quizzes) equal 15% of the instructional hours. Please read the following statements to understand how the college's attendance policy affects our course:

- If you fail to take **3 consecutive weekly quizzes before the withdrawal date**, then I will withdraw you from the class, and you will earn a grade of W.
- If you fail to take **3 consecutive weekly quizzes after the withdrawal date**, then I will withdraw you from the class, and you will earn a grade of F.
- If you fail to take **4 weekly quizzes intermittently**, then I will withdraw you from the class and assign a grade of W (before the withdrawal date) or F (after the withdrawal date).

# **Grading Policies**

You will be graded on your participation and successful completion of assignments in this course. Your final grade in ACA 122 will be determined by your grades on the following assignments:

You will receive one of six grades in this course: **A, B, C, D, F,** or **W**. To pass ACA 122 and receive transfer credit for the course, you must earn an A, B, or C.

# Late Assignment Policy

Each week, a new folder will be available to you by 8:00 a.m. on Wednesday. All weekly assignments are due by 4:00 p.m. on Tuesdays. All assignments must be submitted on Sakai.

You will be allowed to submit late assignments; however, five points will be deducted for every day that the assignment is late starting with the day that it is due. For example, if an assignment is due on Tuesday at 4:00 p.m., and you submit it on Wednesday, I will deduct 10 points from your total score; the highest grade you could receive would be a 90%. If an assignment is due on Tuesday at 4:00 p.m., and you submit it at 5:00 p.m., then I will deduct 5 points from your total score. The highest grade you could receive would be a 95%. It is your responsibility to make arrangements with me for late work or missed assignments.

Assignments, Forum posts, and Blog entries will NOT be accepted more than one week after the due date. Late points will be deducted.

You cannot submit a weekly quiz late. You can take the weekly quiz on Sakai twice before the deadline, but at 4:00 p.m. on Tuesdays, your access to the weekly quiz is removed.

### Extra Credit Opportunities

You may earn up to 50 extra credit points toward your attendance grade by [1] attending a Durham Tech event and/or [2] answering Chapter Review questions in your textbook, *Success by Design*. Submit your extra credit to your instructor as an attachment to an email message.

[1] You may earn 25 points toward your attendance grade for participating in any activity, workshop, seminar, or event sponsored by Durham Tech. The <u>Durham Tech Events Calendar</u> is posted on the college website. You may also earn 25 points by meeting with your advisor to discuss your registration plans for the upcoming semester(s).

To receive the extra credit, turn in a typed five-sentence paragraph (at least) about your experience. Each paragraph describing your participation in each college activity is worth 25 extra credit points. You may turn in two extra credit paragraphs describing two different Durham Tech events for up to 50 extra credit points.

[2] You may also earn 5 extra credit points toward your attendance grade for every Chapter Review question you answer in *Success by Design*. Choose up to 10 questions from multiple chapters. Type your answers and indicate the chapter and the question number. You may earn up to 50 extra credit points. You may also turn in fewer responses for fewer extra credit points (for example, 5 questions for 25 points).
